

The Visitor from Afar

For Pentatonic Instrument and Two Bass Recorders

Instrumentation: the pentatonic instrument can be an alto recorder, but something exotic is preferred. A Native American Flute in A or a Chinese Hulusi in C would be great.

Melody and variations: the basses play measures 5--8 under the variations. The performer is invited to make up more or different variations.
